Being a victim of a crime is a very disturbing experience. This information has been designed to describe some of the rights crime victims have in Wisconsin. It may help you in obtaining present and future services.

- An arrest may not be made during the initial investigation of the crime you reported. The assigned officer will continue to investigate your crime. You may contact the investigating officer, noted above, at anytime to report additional information, ask questions, or determine the status of your investigation. If an arrest is made, a law enforcement officer will contact you to let you know this has occurred.

Adult Offenders

- If an adult offender has been arrested and confined in jail, contact the Dodge County Jail (920) 386-3734 to determine if the offender has been released from the jail. This case will be referred to the Dodge County District Attorney's Office for prosecution.
- If an adult offender has been identified, but not confined in jail, the case will be referred to the Dodge County District Attorney's Office for prosecution or the Municipal Attorney.
- Criminal prosecution of adult offenders will be handled by the Dodge County District Attorney's Office.
- In domestic violence or personal injury cases, you may request that the Dodge County Jail notify you if or when this individual is released from custody.

Juvenile Offenders

- If a juvenile offender has been taken into custody and detained, contact the investigating officer to determine if the juvenile is being held in custody or has been released. This case will be referred to the Department of Human Services Juvenile Intake Worker for review.
- If a juvenile offender has been identified but not detained, the case will be referred to the Dodge County Department of Human Services Juvenile Intake Worker for review.
- A Juvenile Intake Worker will contact you to advise you of the status of the case.

Crime Victim Compensation Program

If this crime resulted in a personal injury, the Crime Victim Compensation Program may be available to help pay for unreimbursed out-of-pocket expenses (such as medical bills, counseling, lost wages) even if there is no arrest or conviction. It is not available for property damage or loss.

General Victim Rights

You have the right to have any stolen, recovered, or seized property, which is no longer needed as evidence, returned to you as quickly as possible. Contact the Investigating Officer (920) 387-7903 to determine when property may be released. You have the right to restitution ordered by the court. For purposes of restitution, it is important that you gather and keep accurate documentation about your losses and provide that information to the Investigating Officer. The District Attorney's Office or Juvenile Intake Worker may also request this information.
